Frank Clark is ComEd's Chairman and Chief Executive Officer. Prior to this appointment, he served as President, responsible for overseeing the company's day-to-day operations. Clark joined ComEd in 1966 as a mail clerk and rose steadily through the ranks, holding positions in corporate policy, support and line functions.

Clark led the development of the African-American Legacy Fund, which supports education, the arts and community development. He is co-chairman of the DuSable Museum Capital Campaign.

Clark serves as the chairman of the board of trustees of the Adler Planetarium and Metropolitan Family Services. He is a member of the board of Chicago Symphony Orchestra, University of Chicago Hospitals and Big Shoulders Fund. He is also a member of the Board of Trustees at DePaul University. Mr. Clark is chairing the 2006 United Way of Metropolitan Chicago Corporate Campaign. His corporate boards include Waste Management and Harris Bank.

Clark received his BA and law degree from DePaul University. He also received an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters from DePaul University's College of Law in 2004. He has received numerous awards, including the prestigious HistoryMakers Award. Clark was ranked among the 50 Most Powerful Black Executives by Fortune magazine.
