

**Jack M. Greenberg**  
**Financial Executive of the Year**  
**1999-2000**

Jack M. Greenberg is Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of McDonald's Corporation, a position to which he was appointed in 1999. Greenberg joined McDonald's in 1982 as executive vice president, chief financial officer and a director. In 1990 he was promoted to senior executive vice president and to vice chairman in 1992. Before joining McDonald's, Greenberg was director of tax services for both the Midwest region and the Chicago office of Arthur Young & Company.

A graduate of DePaul University, College of Commerce, Mr. Greenberg also earned a Juris Doctor Degree from the University's College of Law. He was a lecturer at both colleges from 1968 to 1978. A certified public accountant, he is a member of the Illinois CPA Society, the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, and the Chicago Bar Association, where he served as former chairman of the federal tax committee and was president of the board of trustees of the Chicago Bar Foundation.

Mr. Greenberg was elected to DePaul University's Board of Trustees in 1990 and served as board chair from 1995-1998. Mr. Greenberg serves on the boards of Arthur J. Gallagher and Company and Harcourt General. He is also a member of the Chicago Lighthouse of the Blind Campaign steering committee and the civic committee of the Commercial Club of Chicago.
