Rex Siquefield is Chairman of Dimensional Fund Advisors Inc., a registered investment advisor with over \$50 billion under management. He received his BS from St. Louis University and his MBA from the University of Chicago. He has contributed numerous articles to books and academic and professional journals. Best known among these are the studies of rates of return *Stocks, Bonds, Bills and Inflation*, co-authored with Roger Ibbotson. He has received two Graham and Dodd Awards for best articles in the Financial Analysts Journal, including the 1996 article, "*Where are the Gains from International Diversification?*"

He was one of the first to successfully apply the academic findings of modern finance to money management. In the early 1970s, he and his colleagues at American National Bank of Chicago pioneered many of the nation's first index funds.

Mr. Siquefield is a director of the German St. Vincent Orphan Home in St. Louis, Missouri, a member of the investment committee of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, and a member of the Board of Trustees of Saint Louis University. He is also a life trustee of DePaul University and a member of its investment committee.
